FROM THE RABBI

In the words of Jane S. Gerber in her book, The Jews of Spain: A History of the Sephardic Experience, "For more than a thousand years, Sepharad (the Hebrew word for Spain) was home to a large Jew-

ish community noted for its richness and virtuosity. Summarily expelled in 1492 and forced into exile, their tragedy of expulsion marked the end of one critical phase of their history and the beginning of another..." Beginning April 26 and concluding on May 6, 2020, RTR will be going to Spain to explore the lives, legacies, traditions of that Jewish community. We will also be encountering the small but vibrant resurgent Jewish communities re-established in Spain while also exploring some of the cultural offerings of the Spanish community.

To start with, we will have a dedicated tour guide fluent in both English and Spanish for the entirety of the trip. We will also be using local guides as well for each city. And though the focus will be on the Jewish experience, we will be looking at the beauty of Spain today including its culture, art such as dancing, music, flamenco, food, and the like.

Our tour will start in Madrid where we will have a panoramic tour of the city along with stops at the monument to Miguel de Cervantes Savedra and Plaza Mayor, site of multiple 'acts of faith' (kiddush haShem) – the infamous 'auto-da-fe' of the Spanish inquisition. We have opportunities to enjoy tapas, visit the Prado, the Palacio Real (Royal Palace) as well as opportunities to explore all that Madrid has to offer.

During this time there will also be a tour of Toledo with a focus on the Jewish quarter along with a tour of the Grand Toledo Cathedral and El Greco Museum.

We will travel by AVE (high-speed rail) to Seville, a city shaped by both Renaissance and Arabic influences. Ancient texts place Jews in Seville at the time of the destruction of Jerusalem and the First Temple in 586 B.C.E. We will also visit the UNESCO World Heritage Site of the Alcazar Palace as well as the Great Cathedral, burial place of Christopher Columbus.

We will spend Shabbat with a local progressive Jewish

community in Seville where yours truly may even participate in the Shabbat evening service, as the congregation does not have a full-time Rabbi.

Our trip will continue to Cordoba home of Moses Maimonides, one of the most important and significant rabbis in all of Jewish history. We will continue with a visit to Grenada and the Palace of the Forgotten, a newly-opened museum focused on the Jewish history of Grenada. We will then fly out to our second to last city stop of Barcelona which will include a visit to the Gothic Quarter and the Ancient Synagogue, which dates back to the 5th century.

Our final city to visit will be Girona, one of the great Kabbalistic Cities just like Tzvat in Israel. Though there are no Jews left living in Girona, we will visit the home of Nachmanides, who defended Judaism in the 13th – Century Disputation of Barcelona. We will also take a side tour of Figueras, home of Salvador Dali and the Teatre Museu Dali, which houses the best and most complete collections of one of my favorite painters and artists.

This is just a sampling of everything that we will be doing along our journey. Included below is a link for more information about our upcoming tour. Please email me RabbiSharff@RTRny.org to add yourself to the list of interested travelers. Then in the fall, we will schedule an informational meeting to learn more about our trip to Spain.

Sephardic Jewry was and continues to be a major part of Jewish life. It has had a profound impact both on the earliest Jews in our nation as well as in the State of Israel. Their lives and their journeys are very much our lives and our journeys as well. We hope you can join us to explore the world and the land they came from.



A member of our larger community is in need of a kidney donation and is appealing to our congregation. Please see her letter below:

As a former member of Temple Beth Torah (before it was RTR), I am reaching out to the con-

gregation for your help. My name is Wendy Wintman. As some of you may be aware, my husband Don is in end stage renal failure and needs a kidney transplant. Both his kidneys are functioning at only 12% as I write this and we don't know how long that will last. At the moment, he is holding steady, thank G-d.

Don has a little more testing to go through, and then he will be placed on the UNOS (national) registry for a cadaver kidney. **But a live donor is so much better for so many reasons. A live kidney will last twice as long and begins to "work" as soon as soon as it is placed in his body.** A cadaver kidney needs to be "woken up" by placing the recipient on dialysis after the transplant until the kidney begins to work on its own. And, there is a shorter waiting time for the transplant to take place.

Once we find a match (through a blood test, initially) the donor needs to go through additional testing and then, if all goes as planned, the transplant is scheduled. I know you will ask what Don's blood type is. It is A+. But that kind of doesn't matter, if he brings in a live donor that is not a perfect match for him, and someone else brings in a live donor that isn't a perfect match for them, but they are a match for another person, they do what's called a swap. This can be a chain of swaps, and it can be a very long chain. As long as you bring in a live donor, you can be part of that swap chain and they match you with the best match for you. There are also those who just want to donate. These are altruistic individuals who are blessings to us all!

The donor doesn't pay anything!! Don's insurance pays for the donor's testing and surgery and follow up. It's not the donor's responsibility!

Don and I receive many questions about organ donation that we cannot answer. That's why you should contact NY Presbyterian/Columbia University Medical Center at the number or email address below. You must give them his name, **Donald Wintman**. They can explain it so much better than me! You will find a lot of information on the website below:





LET'S TALK ART

This will be the first of a series of descriptions of the Artwork that we now have displayed in various areas, both inside and outside at The Reform Temple of Rockland. In this one, we will describe those sculptures outside the main entrance to on the upper level.




Approaching Temple, on the left side of the staircase to the main entrance is *Shared Harvest*, a figure of a seated woman holding the fruits of a harvest. The sculpture has many interpretations. It could be a symbol of Sukkot or something else. That is for you to decide. Created by artist Judith Peck, a renowned sculptor, it stands eight feet ten inches mounted on a solid granite base. Originally commissioned by TBE and donated by Israel Katz, it was dedicated on November 12, 1971.

Opposite the Temple entrance, between two trees is the *Memorial to our Six Million*. The metal sculpture was designed and created by Israeli sculptor, Yehiel Shemi. Shemi stated, "This black and white sculpture gives a striking symbolism to despair and hope, destruction and light-future. I had the feeling while working and thinking about it-that there must be that 'Light-future-hope' element in the sculpture, as well as the past." Shemi also described the main section "symbolizing the death of the Six Million" and the white base as the Hope for the Future. Commemorating the Holocaust, the work was originally dedicated at TBE on October 1, 1971 in memory of Morris Schleifman and family.





Approaching Temple, on the right side of the staircase to the main entrance is *The Binding of Isaac*, by Shirley Zwang, a sculpture purchased through contributions made to the Art Fund.
